

DOC NYC WRAPS SUCCESSFUL 2020 EDITION

ONLINE FESTIVAL DREW DOC NYC'S BIGGEST AUDIENCE EVER, FROM ALL 50 STATES, D.C. AND PUERTO RICO FOR PROGRAM OF MORE THAN 200 FILMS AND EVENTS; PRESENTED OVER 19 DAYS, 11TH ANNUAL EDITION WAS LONGEST EVER

NEW YORK, November 30, 2020 – DOC NYC, America's largest documentary festival, wrapped its 2020 edition on Sunday, November 29 with, by many metrics, its most successful outing to date. This year's DOC NYC was presented entirely online and was available to audiences across the U.S. for the first time. The program, running an unprecedented 19 days, offered more than 200 documentary features and shorts, including 22 world premieres, from 35 countries; hosted dozens of live conversations with filmmakers and special guests for viewers worldwide; and drew record audiences from all 50 states, as well as Washington, D.C. and Puerto Rico.

"In a challenging year for festivals and other arts organizations, we are overjoyed that DOC NYC 2020 was able to reach audiences across the US, allowing us to draw our biggest number of attendees ever," said DOC NYC Executive Director Raphaela Neihausen.

In addition to reaching new audiences—more than 38,000 viewers who watched more than 2.8 million minutes of films on DOC NYC's streaming platform—the festival's 2020 edition also saw significant growth in traffic to its website, with more than 250,000 visitors from across the U.S. and more than 180 countries. DOC NYC also saw major growth in its numbers of followers on all its social media platforms, creating an active and vibrant online community that produced more than 110,000 online interactions.

After pivoting to a new online format this spring for its DOC NYC PRO professional development programming, DOC NYC also launched several new initiatives in the lead up to and during the festival. Those included Road Trip, offering virtual visits with filmmakers, festivals, and film organizations in ten documentary hubs across America; Documentary New Leaders, honoring sixteen industry leaders who are furthering

diversity and equity in the field; and DOC NYC Live, a series of **over forty live online** conversations with filmmakers and guests during the festival that drew more than 70,000 viewers in 123 different countries around the world.

As the festival concluded, the organization also announced details for upcoming DOC NYC Live events featuring in-depth discussions with filmmakers from its influential 2020 Short List: Shorts and Short List: Features lineups for the year's leading documentary awards contenders, Tuesday, December 8 and Wednesday, December 9, respectively. Special guests featured in this year's DOC NYC Live program during the festival included Representatives Karen Bass, Barbara Lee and Ayanna Pressley; activist and philosopher Angela Davis; restaurateurs Guy Fieri, Marcus Samuelsson, Antonia Lofaso, Maneet Chauhan, and Christian Petroni; filmmakers Werner Herzog and Stanley Nelson; chess grandmaster Garry Kasparov; longtime news anchor Ted Koppel; New York Fashion Week founder Fern Mallis; fashion designer Nicole Miller; author David Mitchell; musician Sona Mohapatra; authors Clive Oppenheimer and Francine Prose; author and filmmaker Astra Taylor; philosopher, activist, and author Cornel West; and actor and filmmaker Alex Winter; along with dozens of other festival filmmakers.

The festival also announced that the 12th edition of DOC NYC will take place November 10-18, 2021.
