Runs Weekly March 1-22**

**Special Two-Day Grant Writing Workshop Takes Place April 5-6**

**Following a successful in-person conference in November, DOC NYC PRO announces an exciting slate of new online events for filmmakers at all stages of their careers. Kicking off March 1, the panels and workshop are available to participants around the world.**

NEW YORK, Feb. 8, 2023 - DOC NYC, America's largest documentary film festival, announced a new lineup of DOC NYC PRO educational programming for March and April, geared towards filmmakers and anyone interested in learning about the documentary industry. The new events focus on vital areas in the early stages of the filmmaking process, featuring invaluable insight from award-winning independent filmmakers and experts from the independent doc community. Covering topics from story development and funding, to thinking through using archival footage, finding international co-producers and grant writing, the program will educate and empower documentary filmmakers to help turn their vision into a film.

The **Winter 2023 Season** consists of four events presented on Wednesdays, March 1-22, in self-contained, 75-minute online sessions. All registrants may participate in the live session and will also receive access to the recorded event, a written transcript, and a copy of any slide

presentations after the livestream. Attendees may purchase individual tickets or a discounted Winter 2023 season pass good for all four sessions.

The **Grant Writing Workshop** is a live, online event presented in two 90-minute sessions on April 5-6; the event will not be recorded.

#### **Developing Your Story**

When developing your documentary story, you face some crucial decisions: Which characters should you follow and how many is too many? Should you put yourself or your family in the film? Or maybe you've been offered the chance to pitch a story that explores a specific urgent topic but you're not sure how to convey the stakes of the project. Peabody Award-winning filmmaker, educator and Chicken and Egg Pictures/Working Films co-founder Judith Helfand (*Love and Stuff*) will explore the thrills and joys of tackling those initial story development hurdles and critical process questions. This session will include Judith's frank but supportive feedback on several pre-selected story ideas.

**Grant Writing Workshop**

Grants expert Tracie Holder presents a two-part intensive workshop on grant writing for documentary filmmakers. In two 90-minute sessions, this workshop offers filmmakers a roadmap to successful grant funding, including best practices for creating proposals for key documentary funders, from government agencies to foundations to private philanthropists.

Taught by seasoned producer, grant writer, and grant panelist Tracie Holder, who has raised millions in grant funding for her own and others' projects, this workshop reviews all aspects of a successful documentary grant writing process, including:

- how to incorporate grant writing as the first step in your creative practice
- the critical components of a successful grant proposal
- how to convey ideas visually
- how to strike a balance between the big, broad brushstroke ideas behind your project and the small details that make your project come alive on the page
- the common mistakes filmmakers make when submitting proposals—and how to avoid them
- insights into the panel of reviewers judging your proposal

Over the course of two live sessions, offered over two consecutive days, attendees will come away with a comprehensive framework for proposal writing and the confidence to execute a competitive proposal.
