

DOC NYC ANNOUNCES THE RETURN OF SPRING SHOWCASE, MAY 18-JUNE 16

NEW YORK, May 10, 2023 – DOC NYC, America's largest documentary festival, announced today that its popular Spring Showcase screening series will return for a third installment. The four-week online Showcase will offer audiences an opportunity to catch some of the year's most talked-about nonfiction episodic series and films, paired with exclusive conversations featuring the creative teams behind them. The free online event runs from Thursday May 18 through Friday June 16 and is available throughout the US, with the addition of two in-person screenings at New York's IFC Center of the films *Judy Blume Forever* (Wed. May 31 at 7pm) and *Wild Life* (Mon. June 12 at 7pm). Among the special guests featured in the 2023 edition of Spring Showcase are Brooke Shields, Lana Wilson, Michael J. Fox, Davis Guggenheim, Rory Kennedy, Chris Smith, Elizabeth Chai Vasarhelyi, Jimmy Chin, Peter Berg, Ondi Timoner, Yoruba Richen, Kyle Westphal, and more.

"DOC NYC is excited to bring back Spring Showcase for its third consecutive year," said the festival's Executive Director Raphaela Neihausen. "We're always delighted to offer year-round opportunities for audiences to discover a diverse array of important nonfiction work - and in this case, free of charge."

This year's Spring Showcase lineup spans a wide variety of nonfiction formats and subjects, from multi-part series to vérité films, covering everything from biographies, to sports, nature, fashion, crime, and current events. A complete lineup is below.
