NEW YORK, March 15, 2024 - Following a successful Winter Season, DOC NYC PRO announced today its Spring Season of online and in-person educational programming for filmmakers at all stages of their careers. The online panels and workshops, which are available to participants around the world, focus on vital areas of the filmmaking process, featuring invaluable insight from award-winning independent filmmakers and experts from the independent doc community. This season covers a range of topics, including DIY awards campaigns, film festival submissions, AI and pitch decks. In addition, two in-person workshops will focus on the crafts of editing and cinematography.

The DOC NYC PRO spring online season consists of four virtual events presented on Wednesdays, April 17, 24, May 1, and May 8 in self-contained, 75-minute online sessions. All registrants joining an online session will also receive access to the recording, a written transcript, and a copy of any slide presentations after the livestream. Attendees may purchase individual tickets or a discounted Spring 2024 Online Season Pass good for all four online sessions.

Two in-person workshops on the crafts of editing and cinematography will be held at the IFC Center in New York City on Wednesday, April 10 and Friday, April 26 with a discounted price for both events.

Artificial Intelligence and the Future of Archival Production

"It is time for the industry to establish standards in response to the new technology, so that trust with our viewers will remain unbroken," reads the November 2023 open letter from the newly established Archival Producer's Alliance (APA). Concerns are rapidly growing around how generative AI (GAI) can create audio, video, and photo-realistic images that are indistinguishable from true historical material and complicate representations of reality. In this talk, Stephanie Jenkins (co-founder of the APA and producer with Florentine Films) will discuss the value and challenges of deep-file archival research and how GAI technologies will help and challenge filmmakers in a new era of technology.
